Welcome to the Consecration of StPeter's Seafarers' Church

Today we gather to mark a significant and joyful milestone in the life of the Sailors Home and Mission to Seafarers in Hong Kong: the consecration of the new Saint Peter's Seafarers' Church within The Mariners new building.

This special occasion not only celebrates the opening of a new sacred space but also honours a long tradition of care and service to the maritime community. As we dedicate this church to the glory of God and the well-being of all who pass through Hong Kong's busy port, we give thanks for the generations of seafarers, chaplains, volunteers, and supporters whose faith and commitment have shaped this mission from its earliest days to the present moment.

In 1863, the journey began with a Sailors Home at West Point, founded by Jardine Matheson and others to serve merchant seafarers. Soon after, Saint Peter's Church was built on the same compound, and by 1885, the Mission to Seafarers had a resident chaplain ministering to visiting crews.

By 1910, the mission expanded to a residential Seamen's Institute on Johnston Road (then Praya East). The Sailors Home and Mission to Seafarers were formerly incorporated together in 1930 and in 1932 they founded a home together based at 40 Gloucester Road, despite wartime damage, the ministry remained resilient, but facilities needed to be updated.

The next era dawned with the construction of the iconic Mariners' Club in Tsim Sha Tsui - a 12-storey facility officially opened in 1967 by Governor Sir David Trench. This building provided accommodation, recreation, spiritual services, and Saint Peter's Church until its closure in 2018 for redevelopment.

Along with the Tsim Sha Tsui site, a second club opened in 1975 in Kwai Chung, near the container terminals, offering drop-in support, ship visits, and welfare outreach. Both centres welcomed partnerships with Apostleship of the Sea, Danish Seamen's Church and German Seamen's Mission, building on a rich ecumenical heritage.

Today, as The Mariners building rises on the Tsim Sha Tsui site, we consecrate this beautiful new Saint Peter's Seafarers' Church. The Mariners provides modern facilities for hospitality, worship, and pastoral care. But above all, this is more than a new building - it's a renewed pledge to serve seafarers.

A warm welcome to all who join us.

As we look forward, may this sacred space strengthen our community, comfort those at sea, and bear witness to God's enduring presence among seafarers, maritime workers, and all connected to the Port of Hong Kong.

ORDER OF SERVICE

The liturgy begins with an Introit, sung by the choir. 'Locus Iste' by Anton Bruckner.

The Archbishop, standing at the door of the church says the following. All STAND

Through the ages, Almighty God has moved his people to build houses of prayer and praise, and to set apart places for the ministry of his holy Word and Sacraments. With gratitude for the building of Saint Peter's Church, we are now gathered to dedicate and consecrate it in God's Name.

Let us pray.

Almighty God, we thank you for making us in your image, to share in the ordering of your world. Receive the work of our hands in this place, now to be set apart for your worship, the building up of the living, and the remembrance of the dead, to the praise and glory of your Name; through Jesus Christ our Lord.

Abp Let the doors be opened.

The doors are opened. With the pastoral staff the Archbishop marks the threshold with the sign of the cross saying

Peace be to this house, and to all who enter here: ▼ In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

As the procession moves into the church, the following hymn shall be sung

Christ is made the sure foundation. and the precious corner-stone, who, the two walls underlying, bound in each, binds both in one, Holy Sion's help for ever, and our confidence alone.

All that dedicated city, dearly loved by God on high, in exultant jubilation pours perpetual melody, God the One, in Threefold glory, singing everlastingly.

To this temple, where we call thee, come, O Lord of hosts, today; with thy wonted loving-kindness, hear thy people as they pray; and thy fullest benediction shed within its walls for ay.

Here vouchsafe to all thy servants gifts of grace by prayer to gain; here to have and hold for ever, those good things their prayers obtain, and hereafter, in thy glory, with thy blessèd ones to reign.

Laud and honour to the Father, laud and honour to the Son, laud and honour to the Spirit, ever Three and ever One, Consubstantial, co-eternal, while unending ages run.

The congregation remains STANDING, the Archbishop begins the Prayer for the Consecration of the Church

Our help is in the Name of the Lord;

Who made heaven and earth.

Abp Let us pray.

Everliving Father, watchful and caring, our source and our end: All that we are and all that we have is yours. Accept us now, as we dedicate this place to which we come to praise your Name, to ask your forgiveness, to know your healing power, to hear your Word, and to be nourished by the Body and Blood of your Son. Be present always to guide and to judge, to illuminate and to bless your people.

A representative of the Sailors Home and Mission to Seafarers continues

Lord Jesus Christ, make this a temple of your presence and a house of prayer. Be always near us when we seek you in this place. Draw us to you, when we come alone and when we come with others, to find comfort and wisdom, to be supported and strengthened, to rejoice and give thanks. May it be here, Lord Christ, that we are made one with you and with one another, so that our lives are sustained and sanctified for your service.

The Chaplain in charge continues

Holy Spirit, open our eyes, our ears, and our hearts, that we may grow closer to you through joy and through suffering. Be with us in the fullness of your power as new members are added to your household, as we grow in grace through the years, when we are joined in marriage, when we turn to you in sickness or special need, and, at the last, when we are committed into the Father's hands.

The Archbishop concludes

Now, O Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, sanctify this place; For everything in heaven and on earth is yours.

Abp Yours, O Lord, is the kingdom;

All And you are exalted as head over all. Amen.

During the following piece of music, the Archbishop moves to the Font. The congregation is invited to turn and face the font together.

Father, we thank you that through the waters of Baptism we die to sin and are made new in Christ. Grant through your Spirit that those baptized here may enjoy the liberty and splendour of the children of God.

There is one Lord, one Faith, one Baptism;

One God and Father of all.

Water is poured into the Font, and the Archbishop says

The Lord be with you.

Facing the Font, the Archbishop says

We thank you, Almighty God, for the gift of water, through which you led your people from slavery to freedom in the promised land and through which your Son was baptized and anointed as Messiah.

We thank you, Father, for the water of Baptism, by which we are united with Christ in his death and resurrection, welcoming those who come to him in faith. Grant, by the power of your Holy Spirit, that those who here are cleansed from sin and born again may continue forever in the risen life of Jesus Christ our Saviour. To him, to you, and to the Holy Spirit, be all honour and glory, now and for ever.

All Amen.

The Archbishop, with water from the Font, blesses the people, who are the spiritual temple, then the walls of the church, and finally, the altar. The GLORIA is sung by all.



The Archbishop proceeds to the Ambo, lays his hands upon it, and says

Father, your eternal Word speaks to us through the words of Holy Scripture and in every age you have spoken through the voices of prophets, pastors, and teachers. Give us ears to hear and hearts to obey. Purify the lives and the lips of those who speak here, that your word only may be proclaimed, and your word only may be heard.

We dedicate this Ambo in the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.



The Commissioning and Blessing of Chaplain and People

The Archbishop addresses the congregation

Abp Catherine has made the declaration and has taken the oaths required by law. Having heard her intention to fulfil the ministry to which she has been called, I shall now license her to serve in this place.

The chaplain kneels before the Archbishop who hands the licence to the chaplain

Abp Catherine, receive this ministry which is both mine and yours, in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit. Chp Amen.

The new chaplain together with the entire congregation STANDS before the Archbishop

Abp Catherine is now duly installed as Chaplain of St. Peter's Church.

She has promised to serve in this ministry faithfully.

Yet the work of the kingdom in this place is not hers alone

but belongs to the whole church.

Together, you are the body of Christ in this place.

Through you God continues his work in the world today.

The five marks of mission recognised by our worldwide

Anglican Communion remind us of our high calling:

- to proclaim the good news of the kingdom;
- to teach, baptise and nurture new believers;
- to respond to human need by loving service;
- to transform unjust structures of society, to challenge violence of every kind and pursue peace and reconciliation;
- to strive to safeguard the integrity of creation, and sustain and renew the life of the earth.

The Archbishop anoints the Altar with the Oil of Chrism on the middle and on each four corners. These five places on the altar are marked by five crosses, symbols of Christ's five wounds. He then says.

Lord God, hear us. Sanctify this Altar dedicated to you. Let it be to us a sign of the heavenly Altar where your saints and angels praise you for ever. Accept here the continual recalling of the sacrifice of your Son. Grant that all who eat and drink at this holy Altar may be fed and refreshed by his flesh and blood, be forgiven for their sins, united with one another, and strengthened for your service.

All Blessed be your Name, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit; now and for endless ages. Amen.

The congregation is SEATED.

Whilst the following anthem is sung the Archbishop now incenses the altar with the thurible, he then returns to his chair, puts on his mitre, is incensed, and sits. The altar is then clothed and prepared for the celebration of the Eucharist

Therefore, in union with the heavenly Jerusalem, with angels in joyful assembly, with all whose names are written in heaven and with the spirits of the righteous made perfect, we lift up our voices to join in the triumphal song of praise:

As we offer you this our sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving, we bring before you this bread and this cup and we thank you for counting us worthy to stand in your presence and serve you.

Send the Holy Spirit on your people and gather into one in your kingdom all who share this one bread and one cup, so that we, in the company of Saint Peter and all the saints, may praise and glorify you for ever, through Jesus Christ our Lord; by whom, and with whom, and in whom, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all honour and glory be yours, almighty Father, for ever and ever.



The Archbishop invites the faithful to receive the sacrament

Jesus is the Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world. Blessed are those who are called to his supper.

All Lord, I am not worthy to receive you, but only say the word, and I shall be healed.

If it is your custom to receive Holy Communion in your own Church you are also welcome to receive the Sacrament here. Please place one hand on top of the other and offer an open palm to the Minister. In keeping with the Archbishop of Canterbury's advice, the host should be held and dipped in the chalice. If you do not normally take Holy Communion you are still invited to come forward to receive a blessing. Please place your arms across your chest and bow your head.
